THE DANGERS OF WEALTH FAR OUTWEIGH THE DANGERS OF POVERTY

Soon after his arrival in Jerusalem, R' Avraham Shaag satisfied his longing to own land in Eretz Israel by buying a strip of land in Jerusalem just outside of the Jaffa Gate. Not long afterwards, when the surge in immigration and the city's expanding commercial activity began causing real estate values to soar, R' Avraham called an agent to sell his property. A puzzled R' Yissachar Ber asked his father why he was selling when the property's value was increasing daily? The tzaddik replied, "It is precisely for that reason. I am afraid that my grandchildren will become wealthy and it is a well-known fact that the dangers of wealth far outweigh the dangers of poverty!" Shortly after R' Avraham's Shaag's death, the value of his particular property skyrocketed. It was on this land that Jerusalem's major business district was built (Ha Ish al ha Choma)
